

## Our New History Mural is Installed!

The Lakewood History Museum is proud to announce our new History Mural is installed. The happy event occurred on 30 March when our mural artist Mindy Barker arrived with assistant installer Keith Musig. Mindy was born in Tacoma and is a graduate of Pacific Lutheran University. She is the owner of Mindy Barker Designs, a one woman

nesses and large-scale murals for public spaces. The Lakewood History Museum Board of Directors interviewed Mindy, reviewed her

work and awarded a contract for a 17 foot. interactive mural highlighting the rich history of the area we call Lakewood. Mural

was to be a colorful historical exhibit filling an existing open space along the main hallway. The parameters of this project was no easy task!

Mindy's vision started with a nod to nature. She looked to the Garry oak tree (Quercus garryana). The Garry oak existed in this area long before European settlement. The species, however, is named after Nicholas Garry, an 1835 deputy governor of the Hudson Bay Company which had large holdings in this area. Mindy decided to use the Garry oak as the unifying structure from which she created seven historically significant vignettes: Time before humans,


